

Business and Entrepreneurial Development

Kid-Preneur

The GEDC partnered up with Head Start in Business to develop and organize a youth entrepreneur workshop for aspiring youth entrepreneurs in Greenstone. The workshop was offered in Geraldton in March and both Geraldton and Longlac in April. Each workshop was attended by 10 participants. They learned about developing a business idea, choosing a business name, developing a logo, producing business cards, how to market their business and pricing product/services. Those who graduated the program were offered a table at the Greenstone Trade Show to showcase their services, and sell their products. The workshop was a success and will be offered in 2025.



Business Week

During business week in October, GEDC held daily lunch & learn forums in both official languages to discuss various topics related to business services and funding. These were held in person, as well as via Zoom. The GEDC partnered with various organizations who presented their small business/non-profit services and funding streams. Presentations were done by NOHFC, NADF, Société Économique de l'Ontario, Métis Nation of Ontario, and Ontario Trillium Foundation.



Greenstone Information Sessions

The GEDC started a new partnership with Greenstone Public Libraries. Longlac Public Library hosted the BDO while they conducted their first ward visit / general information session. The Beardmore Public Library hosted the second session. The purpose of these visits was to reach potential clients unable to come to the GEDC office located in Geraldton. A future visit to Nakina is planned for 2025.

Greenstone Trade Show 2024

GEDC partnered with the Geraldton District Chamber of Commerce and the Municipality of Greenstone to bring back the Greenstone Trade Show. It was a welcome addition to local events and had many people out to enjoy what the trade show had to offer. It was also a great way to showcase our Kid-Preneur participants and their businesses.

The highlight of the event was our keynote speaker Kathleen Swado from Sister Bear Designs. She is an indigenous artisan from Thunder Bay who shared her personal story and business journey.


