Agriculture Sector Initiative (A.S.I) —Workplan Update

Objective: Increase public awareness and encourage agriculture sector business development in the Greenstone region. This will be done through the assistance and guidance of Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA) and in collaboration with the Municipality of Greenstone.

GEDC officially launched the A.S.I. in 2018, an internal workplan was developed, below are highlights of progress made to date. A formal review and update of the workplan will take place January 2020 due to pending Agriculture Study.



Workplan Execution:

- 2017-2018: Clients and Stakeholders approached GEDC for information on the Agriculture Sector.
- May 1, 2018: GEDC Agriculture themed AGM with keynote speaker, Kendal Donahue, OMAFRA
- July 2018 (on-going): Research and information gathering stage, feasibility of soil sampling analysis report event/ session attendance, assess land potential, site visits etc.
 - Initial SWOT analysis conducted with OMAFRA
 - Quarterly meetings with OMAFRA Advisors and Municipality of Greenstone.
 - ♦ Attendance at Aquaculture Workshop in Nipigon.
 - ♦ Completion OMAFRA online training
 - ♦ Online research and information gathering from other organizations.
 - Reached out to consultants regarding Agriculture Studies and Soil Analysis Studies.
 - ♦ Attendance at Northern Ontario Farm Innovation Alliance (NOFIA) Greenstone Consultation meeting.
- October 2018 (on-going): develop food production through features stories on existing activities, develop the
 market through working with / highlighting local businesses and what they have to offer, partner up local business
 and outlying businesses looking for distributor (match-making), agriculture website page, promote assistance and
 support available for hobbyists who want to expand.
 - Promoted local activities through feature stories in GEDC's quarterly Newsletter.
 - Reached out to local distributors and hobbyists for information
 - ♦ Provided support / advertising services to out-lying businesses
 - Launched a Agriculture website page http://www.gedc.ca/article/agriculture-11681.asp

Agriculture Sector is new for the Greenstone Region so there is no baseline information to draw from which is leading to an extensive research and information gathering stage for the A.S.I. Although there are some agriculture themed concepts in our 2016 "New Ideas Business Report" there is still the need for a preliminary study and research to be done before we can identify possibilities for the Greenstone Region. Tax Help for Small Businesses

With the assistance from CRA professionals, a workshop was organized by GEDC for small businesses and selfemployed individuals in the Greenstone region. General bookkeeping concepts, best practices, business tax deductions, and common tax errors were some of the topics covered in the workshop.



May 29th, 2019 - Small Business CRA Workshop

The session was well received by more than 10 businesses, which were keen to learn more about their tax obligations. A key feature of the workshop was the ability to speak to a CRA professional in-person and to ask questions.

Participants were advised of additional services that the CRA provides. One of the services which were highlighted during the session was an in-person visit from a CRA Liaison Officer. This free service provides an opportunity for businesses to review their books/records and also receive recommendations on strengthening their bookkeeping systems.
