Greenstone Boundaries

In January 2001 the largest Incorporated Municipality in Canada was created. Greenstone is the amalgamation of the former towns of Geraldton, Longlac, Nakina, Beardmore, Caramat, Jellicoe, Orient Bay and MacDiarmid.

The catchment area also includes the First Nations communities of Aroland, Long Lake #58, Ginoogaming, Lake Nipigon Ojibway, Rocky Bay, Poplar Point and Sand Point.

In the mid 1980's, a group of business owners and community leaders came together from the area's four larger communities to create a new regional economic development organization. They sought a name that would reflect the entire area's geography without identifying one community. The new community was given the name of Greenstone under the Provincial order in 1997, because it had become a common reference for provincial and federal governments through the 1990's.

Location

The Municipality of Greenstone is situated along Highway 11 approximately 300 kilometres North East of Thunder Bay, Ontario. Vast and sparsely populated, Highway 11 has some of the most scenic drives across Ontario with waterfalls, geologic formation, and numerous lakes, rivers, and wetlands.

In addition, the Municipality operates 3 landfill sites owned by the [Ministry of Natural Resources](#), located at Wildgoose Lake, Camp 25, and Pamela Lake.

Accepted Materials

Household waste is accepted at all of the 7 landfill sites in the Municipality. Other refuse, such as tires, appliances, and metal are accepted at the sanitary landfill sites in Beardmore, Geraldton, Longlac and Nakina only.

Restrictions apply according to the Certificate of Approval issued by the [Ministry of the Environment](#). Contact the Public Services Department to confirm eligibility of other acceptable materials at (807)854-1100.

Refrigerant Materials

Fridges and other appliances containing refrigerant materials will not be accepted at any municipal sanitary landfill (Beardmore, Geraldton, Longlac and Nakina) unless:

- 1) tagged by a licensed technician and certified Freon-free, or
 - 2) tagged with a "Freon-Free" sticker. These stickers are available at Ward offices for a fee of \$50.00.

- 57.4% of the AOU is softwood or coniferous forest types
- 25.5% of the AOU is hardwood or deciduous forest types
- 17.2% of the AOU is mixed wood forest types
- Less than one-half of 1% of the forest in the Boreal region is harvested annually
- Greenstone encompasses three Forestry Management Units:
 - Kenogami Forest
 - Ogoki Forest
 - Lake Nipigon/Armstrong Forest
