GEDC launches Lunch N' Learn Workshop Series



GEDC Business Capacity Inventory Launch

The Greenstone Economic Development Corporation (GEDC), in partnership with Greenstone Gold Mines, AV Terrace Bay Inc. and the Municipality of Greenstone, is pleased to announce the launch of the Business Capacity Inventory project at the annual Trade Show in Geraldton on April 13-14, 2018. The prospect of the imminent development of the Greenstone Gold Mine, in addition to the present opportunities available in the region through the forestry industry and municipal services have made it neces-



sary for GEDC to ensure that these entities are fully aware of the expertise and resources available in the Greenstone area. GEDC has retained SNC Lavalin Inc. to assist in the execution of this project, building upon previous analysis conducted for GEDC.

The goal of this inventory will be to outline the capacity of Greenstone businesses, as well as indicate their interest level in partnering to become suppliers to regional development projects. As such, we have tailored this undertaking to the needs of the region by actively engaging with the three largest procurement sectors within the Greenstone region: Mining, Forestry and Municipal Services. The business capacity inventory will allow procurement departments from these sectors to identify potential local suppliers that can execute contracts, or parts of contracts, on their respective projects.



GEDC recently released two publications:


Entrepreneurs' Responsibilities and Obligations of Running a Business Instruction Booklet.
