

Creating an Environment of Safety and Trust

Health and Safety Regulations for Small Businesses

Health and Safety is a fundamental aspect to every business that impacts both employers and workers. One of the keys to ensuring everyone is safe, and that workers know their rights, is through The Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHSA). The OHSA is legislation that applies to all workplaces and is enforced by the Ministry of labour. The OHSA establishes procedures for dealing with workplace hazards and provides enforcement of the law where compliance has not been achieved voluntarily by workplace parties.

Employers are responsible in maintaining health and safety in the workplace. The OHSA outlines duties for employers which includes and is not limited to the following:

- do everything you reasonably can to protect your workers in each situation
- inform, instruct and supervise workers to protect their health and safety
- make sure that every worker and supervisor takes the required training, including basic occupational health and safety awareness training, and keep records of that training

Below are 3 general tips to work towards ensuring a safe work environment:

- 1. Create a bulletin board where required posters/information/regulations/policies are displayed place this information in a conspicuous area that is accessible by all workers.
- 2. Perform monthly site inspections (e.g. third week of each month) that way these are completed regularly and if missed on the third week, there is time to finish the inspection during the fourth week.
- 3. Continuously update your Health and Safety Program.




