Built (1743 Joseph Isbister opens Henley House)
Newmm.

? French post 60 m. above Henley during spring →

1759 Wolfe/Montcalm - Quebec taken.

Henley House plundered by French
- probably destroyed.

1764 Henley House rebuilt.

"pedlars" built post 70 miles(?)
from Henley House.

1774 Henley House operating
1777-78 Gloucester House
Built to compete
with Henley House

35 mi. upstream from Martin Falls
(Upasheway L. - trib. of Albany
between Osnaberg House & Martin Falls.

1790 Fort-Pic built.

Martin Falls House Established. 1794

Gloucester House shown on large St. Ann's lake near source of Albany R.

1798 Gloucester House
in operation.

1800 Long Lake Fort built probably on site of old French post. Orig. a. N.W. Co. Fort.
Before 1804 X.Y. Co. operated post on site of Fort Pic.

Fort Pic went to H.B. Co.

Henley House still listed

Gloucester House isn't.

Fort Mamattawa
Before 1832 it was South River House
- junction of Kenogami and Kabinakagami rivers.

1821 Hudson's Bay took over Long Lake Fort from North West Co. Dated 1821

Long Lake (1832) Fort shown on map. 1830

Fort Pic on 1856 List - not later.

Henley House
Gloucester House
Long Lake Fort
Fort Mamattawa
Martin Falls House.

1865
Fort Pic operated by H.B. Co. until 1865.

1860 Fort Mamattawa closed and re-established 30 mi. down river at mouth of Webashi river - called New Post (i.e. 30 mi. south of the Albany R. Falls House listed.

Nothing left of Henley House.

1860 New Post moved back to original 1832 site and named English River House.
